Why extract information from ThruLines?

Organize information More accessible Searchable

To see ThruLines

- Take a DNA test at Ancestry.com.
- Opt in to see your DNA matches and to be seen by your DNA matches.
- Link your DNA test to your family tree.
- Set your tree to be public or private/searchable.
- Work on tree completeness.

The importance of descendancy research

How to identify cousins today who lead back to an MRCA (Most Recent Common Ancestor)?

Find your grandparents' siblings and children and grandchildren. Find your great-grandparents' siblings and children and grandchildren.

Tree completeness directly impacts the ability to identify your matches and the ability to have a stronger conclusion that you are only related through *one* MRCA.

The structure of ThruLines

Horizontal = generation Vertical = lineage
